New Laws Effective January 1, 2017

Illinois still has no budget and the stopgap measure that was passed expired on December 31st. Even with much of legislator's time spent on budget issues, the Illinois General Assembly managed to pass almost 200 pieces of legislation that were then signed into law by Governor Rauner in 2016. Below are new laws that are of importance to contractors.

Public Act 99-0765, HB 4036

Mandates employers provide unpaid work weeks of leave to any employee who is a victim of domestic or sexual violence or has a family member who is a victim; amount of allowed time off is determined based on the size of the business.

Public Act 99-0639, House Bill 4529

Abolishes the Illinois Building Commission. Amends the Capital Development Board Act. Transfers the Illinois Building Commission's function of identifying local building codes to the Capital Development Board.

Public Act 99-610, House Bill 4999

Amends the Right to Privacy in the Workplace Act to make it illegal for an employer or prospective employer to request or require an employee or applicant to access a personal online account (such as Facebook) in the presence of the employer. It is also illegal to request or require that an employee or applicant invite the employer to join a group affiliated with any personal online account of the employee, or applicant, or join an online account established by the employer.

Public Act 99-0673, HB 5660

Amends Public Construction Bond Act. Provides that verified notice shall be deemed filed on the date personal services occurs or the date when (rather than where) the verified notice is mailed.

Public Act 99-0504, House Bill 5913

Amends the Plumbing License Law to provide that sponsors of continuing education shall meet the criteria provided by the Board of Plumbing Examiners and the Plumbing Code Advisory Council. Provides that CE courses and approved courses of instruction in plumbing in colleges, universities and trade schools shall be supervised directly by an Illinois licensed plumber only.

Public Act 99-841, House Bill 6162

Under this new law, employees may now use personal sick leave benefits for purposes dealing with a child, spouse, sibling, parent, mother-in-law, fatherin-law, grandchild, grandparent or step parent. The employee can use such time as may be necessary on the same terms that employee would use the time for their own illness or injury.

Public Act 99-0534, Senate Bill 1120

Makes it a felony if over \$500 in rental equipment is not returned within 3 days after the rental period has expired.

Public Act 99-0852, Senate Bill 2450

Amends the Mechanics Lien Act by extending the time period to file a mechanics lien on a commercial project from 3 to 5 years.

Public Act 99-0584, SB 3104

Makes the failure of reporting apprenticeship reports a violation for entities subject to the State Construction Minority and Female Building Trades Act.

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EPA WATERSENSE TO ADDRESS DIVERTERS

A bath and shower diverter is a device that diverts the flow of water either toward the tub spout or toward the showerhead. This product is commonly found in bathtubs equipped with a showerhead, such as in residential bathrooms and private commercial restrooms found in hotels.

Many bath and shower diverters currently installed leak a small amount of water from the tub spout while they are engaged and the water is being diverted to the showerhead. In fact, the current national plumbing standard - American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) A112.18.1/Canadian Standards Association (CSA) B125.1 - sets an allowable leak rate of 0.1 gallons per minute (gpm) for a bath and shower diverter prior to life cycle testing (i.e., when new) and 0.2 gpm after life cycle testing (i.e., at the end of the product's life). This is equivalent to a half gallon and a full gallon of water, respectively, wasted over the course of a typical shower. Many older bath and shower diverters installed in homes across the United States have much higher leak rates, resulting in considerable water waste with every shower. Field studies have shown bath and shower diverter leak rates averaging three to eight times the leak rate allowed by the current standard. In some cases, the studies identified leaks of up to 3.0 gpm, which is more than the flow rate from a typical showerhead.

In recent years, the California Energy Commission has led the charge in adopting efficiency requirements for bath and shower diverters that aim to significantly reduce leak rates over the current national standard. However, WaterSense has identified viable and readily available bath and shower diverter models that can eliminate leaks altogether.

To help increase water efficiency in the residential and commercial sectors, recognize the most efficient technology available, and eliminate unnecessary leaks and water waste, EPA has issued a Notice of Intent (NOI) to develop a specification for bath and shower diverters. Replacing a leaking diverter with a more efficient model could result in considerable water and energy savings.

Interested parties are invited to provide written comments on WaterSense's NOI to label bath and shower diverters. Please send any comments or suggestions to watersense-products@erg.com.

OSHA has released its guidelines for small employers who fall under the scope of the Silica in Construction standard. Whenever OSHA publishes a significant standard such as 1926.1153, the Agency is required to develop materials to help small employers comply.

The "Small Entity Compliance Guide for the Respirable Crystalline Silica Standard for Construction" is in an easy to read format and it is intended to make the new silica standard more understandable to nonattorneys.

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Key Risk Indicators – Are Yours Leading or Lagging?

Data can reveal a lot more than just profits and losses

Data is everywhere. There aren't too many day-to-day experiences any more that aren't somehow linked to data. With the explosion of available data, and the inherent responsibility of using it wisely, how can businesses be sure they focus on the right pieces of data and develop meaningful metrics to use it to measure results? Where do you even start?

First, Obtain Data

First, know what your risks are—*the key risk indicators*. Assemble data and information collected from your loss history, recorded near misses, observed unsafe acts or unsafe conditions, self risk assessments, workplace inspections, corporate audits, employee training, and perception surveys. This data can help you see the "big picture" of the effectiveness of your current risk management programs and help you anticipate future loss exposures to proactively work to prevent them.

Second, Measure the Overall Risk

Now the fun begins! Put the data to work for you to help predict the possibility of future incidents. Your goal is to classify the data based on its overall risk frequency and severity, and use it to determine how your business could be affected in the event of an incident. Once you analyze how specific risks could impact your operational efficiency and profitability, you will have a clearer picture of what needs attention.

Third, Identify Areas Needing Improvement

These areas will hurt you the most in the event of an incident. Focus both on physical and personnel assets. This may be a policy or process, a building, a machine or tool, or a driver, mechanic, or your best salesperson. Your results here should be prioritized: put the most severe risks first based on their potential impact.

Fourth, Take Action – Implement!

Use the information revealed in the previous three steps to take action. Correct areas identified as needing improvement. Implement new policies and/or procedures. Communicate with your employees, both on the positives discovered through your data collection, and on areas necessitating changes. Follow up with training to ensure they understand the risks and fix unsafe behaviors. Empower your employees to take control whenever they recognize hazards. Your actions should be consistent with other management processes and procedures to ensure you are sending a clear and consistent message to employees.

The Risk Management Conundrum

The hardest part of risk management is tying a metric to incidents that *don't* happen because of good, consistent risk management practices. Focusing on leading indicators is a strong start. Your overall culture will drive your practices. Your practices will drive your results. Your results will speak for themselves. Using leading indicators to identify and control problem areas before they control you is central to a strong risk management culture.

Start Today to Improve Your Tomorrows

Ask yourself this simple question: "Is my risk management program leading or lagging?" If it's lagging, data analysis can help your business make up ground. Using risk management indicators to take the lead on operational efficiency and improved profitability is a great place to start. Where will the data take you?




IMSCA ELECTS OFFICERS

2017 Standard Mileage Rates for Business, Medical and Moving Announced

The Internal Revenue Service has issued the 2017 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on Jan. 1, 2017, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 53.5 cents per mile for business miles driven, down from 54 cents for 2016
- 17 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes, down from 19 cents for 2016
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations

The business mileage rate decreased half a cent per mile and the medical and moving expense rates each dropped 2 cents per mile from 2016. The charitable rate is set by statute and remains unchanged.

The standard mileage rate for business is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile. The rate for medical and moving purposes is based on the variable costs.

Taxpayers always have the option of calculating the actual costs of using their vehicle rather than using the standard mileage rates.

A taxpayer may not use the business standard mileage rate for a vehicle after using any depreciation method under the Modified Accelerated Cost Recovery System (MACRS) or after claiming a Section 179 deduction for that vehicle. In addition, the business standard mileage rate cannot be used for more than four vehicles used simultaneously.

These and other requirements are described in <u>Rev. Proc. 2010-51</u>. <u>Notice 2016-79</u>, posted on IRS. gov, contains the standard mileage rates, the amount a taxpayer must use in calculating reductions to basis for depreciation taken under the business standard mileage rate, and the maximum standard automobile cost that a taxpayer may use in computing the allowance under a fixed and variable rate plan.

News from the PHCC National Educational Foundation

Year End Tax Planning Tips

In a Foundation webinar conducted recently, PHCC member and CPA Michael Bohinc shared what you need to know about year-end tax planning and what to expect in 2017. Below are some key tips to keep in mind.

- Due Dates That Have Changed The due date for Form 1065 for Partnerships has moved from April 15th to March 15th due to large amounts of personal returns being delayed due to partnership returns being delayed (K-1s).
- The due date for Form 1120 (C Corporation) has moved from March 15th to April 15th if you are on a calendar year ending fiscal business cycle.
- If you are on a June 30th year-end, your taxes are still due on Sept. 15th (3rd Month after "business year end")
- Check your state tax return due dates- The due date for sending W-2, W-3 1099-MISC has moved from February to January 31st.

Help prevent fraud - taxpayer theft cases rose to over 700,000 this past tax season. Protect your information by shredding financial paperwork before discarding, check your credit report regularly, audit your numbers regularly and secure your computer network.

Refunds will be not be issued before late February for earlier filers in reaction to the increase in fraudulent tax claims that appear early in the year.
