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President's **THOUGHTS**

As our plumbing code revisions are in the comment period, we continue to upgrade our code to provide the best plumbing code in the nation.

As we continually update the written portion, we have yet to upgrade the enforcement of the code in the field. This has seemed difficult as the enforcement issue never gets the same attention as the other portions. This lack of attention detracts from the issue, but it still remains that enforcement should be a top priority.

Inspectors probably spend 90% of their time enforcing the code on projects where licensed plumbers and registered contractors are doing the work, while they spend the other 10% of their time, sometimes 0%, enforcing the code on unlicensed handymen, house flippers, maintenance companies, and house building repair companies doing plumbing work.

As our buildings age they need repair and revisions constantly, but many municipalities do not attempt to enforce/inspect any work done on these so-called smaller, less glamourous projects that take longer to inspect. This non-action allows unlicensed individuals to thrive unchecked, causing code infractions and ongoing issues for homeowners.

The solution is that these municipalities must enforce all of the plumbing code on all work, large or small. These municipalities must be held accountable by IDPH's Plumbing & Water Quality Program. Municipalities say that they cannot afford the manpower for this level of enforcement, but if the inspection program is properly permitted and the costs for permits is reasonable, the revenue from permits will cover the necessary costs involved.

Now to the "how" to do this. We must convince the State to mandate adoption of a full inspection program in each county, and they in turn must insist that all cities in the county comply.

A big help would be for the State to allow local municipalities to collect the fines from issuing citations for unlicensed work. This gives the cities incentives to pursue these cases, which is now an income source only for the State.

In helping the State help the counties, I propose coming up with a standard ordinance that counties and cities can adopt without having to recreate the wheel. Having a standard ordinance that the State inspector could approve, would streamline getting the county and city boards to approve and implement. The proposed fee schedule can be easily adjusted locally. And making forms available online for download would help programs keep their costs down.

EMPLOYERS MUST POST OSHA FORM 300A

OSHA reminds employers that they must post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes job-related injuries and illnesses logged during 2018. Each year, between February 1 and April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and those in certain low-hazard industries are exempt from OSHA recordkeeping and posting requirements. 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

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IL DEPARTMENT OF LABOR ECA REPORTING REQUIREMENT

Any contractor who had construction services performed for it in 2018 by an individual, sole proprietorship or partnership that is not an employee of the contractor must file a report by April 30, 2019 with the Department of Labor. The report must include the following information:

- 1. contractors name, address, business identification number;
- 2. the name, address and business identification number of each entity or person providing services, along with total amount paid for services and materials and equipment during the taxable year.

A contractor, who fails to submit a report to the Department or submits a false report, violates the Act and is subject to civil penalties and debarment.

You MUST use and attach the IDOL provided file to the submission form.



Do we need to keep copies of employees' Identification along with their I-9 form? Or can we just physically verify it and fill the information in on the form?

By way of some background, employers are obligated to ensure that a Form I-9 is properly completed for all new employees within three day of hire. The employer must physically review the original documents presented by an employee in connection with the Form I-9 (other than a birth certificate, for which a certified copy is allowed) to ensure that the document(s) presented establish the employee's identity and authorization to work in the United States, and a member of the company's management generally needs to sign the form to confirm and indicate that this is the case. When this is not feasible, such as in cases where an employee is hired remotely as may be the case here with employees in other states, an employer can designate an authorized representative to fill out the Form and review the documents, and this includes contracting with another person or business to verify the employee's identity and work eligibility. Keep in mind, though, that if an agent, representative or independent contractor fails to sufficiently complete the Form on behalf of the employer or accepts inappropriate documents, etc., his or her actions and any violations or non-compliance are attributable to the employer.

Getting specifically to your question: employers have discretion to make photocopies of the documents presented by employees in support of the Form I-9, or not, but must be consistent across the board with whatever approach it takes. This means that it cannot photocopy the supporting documents for some employees and not others. Rather, when it comes to deciding whether or not to make copies of the documents presented (and employees must have discretion to choose which acceptable documents to provide), it is an "all or nothing" proposition. Either way, employers are obligated to retain the Form I-9 (and copies of supporting documents, if the employer elects to make them) for a period of three years after the date of hire, or one year after the date of employment termination, whichever is the longer period. This record retention obligations applies regardless of the location or jurisdiction of the worker. Employers that have employees working in multiple states can elect to store I-9 Forms locally in the offices (or states) where they work or centrally at a corporate headquarters or similar location. However, if audited or required to produce the Forms by an appropriate government agency, court order, etc., the employer must ensure that the documents can be readily produced even if they are housed out of state. I-9 Forms should be kept separately from personnel file documents, though, whether in a separate I-9 file for each employee, or in a combined file dedicated solely to Form I-9 retention. Employers that choose the latter route often organize the Forms I-9 alphabetically or by date of hire to ensure ready access if/when necessary.



RISK MANAGEMENT CORNER



Vehicle Preparation

While it's true that a driver's skills, training, and experience are key to safety on the road, there's plenty that can be done before a vehicle leaves the garage to help a driver stay safe between Point A and Point B. Make sure all your vehicles are prepared — inside and out — for their intended use before you send employees out into traffic.

In the Cab

Ditch the distractions — Distracted driving is a leading cause of accidents, injuries, and deaths on the road. Train your drivers to refrain from using their mobile devices while operating a vehicle and avoid using communication devices (even hands-free ones) unless absolutely necessary.

Keep it clean — It's common knowledge that a clean workspace is a safe and efficient workspace. Make sure to remove clutter that can draw a driver's attention away from the road or impede the use of pedals. Make sure windows are clean, and mirrors and back-up cameras are clear.

Prepare for an emergency — Even a vehicle with an impeccable service record can break down, so keep an emergency roadside kit in each vehicle. Equipment recommendations include a cell phone and charger, a first-aid kit, flashlight, flares or reflectors, jumper cables, water, and blankets.

Under the hood

Get a grip — When the rubber meets the road, your vehicles' tires can mean the difference between disaster and safe arrival. Make sure the tire tread, inflation level, and overall tire condition are safe for use. Swap the tires with new ones if they're getting old or worn. If you do business in a cold-weather state, make sure your vehicles are equipped with the proper tires for the weather.

Practice constant care — Regular maintenance will help ensure that your vehicles are in proper working order. Oil changes, transmission service, and brake service are just a few of the recommended procedures. Consult a trusted technician for frequency and extent of service.

Watch for recalls — Manufacturers often send out notices when a safety recall is ordered, but taking an active role in safety is always the best policy. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration offers a vehicle identification number look-up tool so you can check if your vehicles are under any safety recalls. Simply visit www.nhtsa.gov/recalls and enter your vehicles' VINs.

An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. So, before you or your employees head out, make sure all your vehicles are ready for what the road has in store.

- Scholarships are awarded in the amount of \$500.00 or more but not to exceed \$2,000.00 and shall be given by the Illinois Auxiliary each year in June, as funds are available, to those who desire to further their education.
