Present time seems to be moving at the same pace as work, every month seems to go by faster and faster. For those of us in the plumbing, heating & cooling industry there is never enough time. The lead times for materials has increased, the pool of qualified techs has decreased and the amount of training our employees need is ever increasing as we strive to keep up with technology. This all may sound negative, but I feel it is extremely positive. It must mean work is good! As I see it, bad times drag on and good times never last long enough. There has been a bounty of work available, and we can't get enough of it. That's why we don't have enough time, material or employees. It does feel good though partnering with other contractors, GC's, Subs, Suppliers, Engineers and Unions that want to move as fast as we do.

I'd like to remind everyone of the upcoming opportunity to find a variety of plumbing products and business solutions at the Illinois PHCC Expo coming up on Friday, March 18th in Oakbrook Terrace, IL. You will find more information on this event in this month's magazine. As I stated last month, in order for us to have a great workforce we have to make sure our Licensed Plumbers have their required 4 hours of continuing ed. You will find a list of CEU classes and registration information in this issue of the magazine.

We at GA Rich are fortunate to be involved in many contractor associations like the PHCC that are "dedicated to the advancement and education of the plumbing and HVAC-R industry for the health, safety and comfort of society and the protection of the environment". Speaking of dedication and protection, our very own Executive Director, Bev Potts spends hours and hours of her time working to protect the Illinois Plumbing License Law and your business. I've asked Bev to give us a glimpse behind the scenes of what it takes to protect the plumber and the businesses that employ them.

From Bev:

Every time a new session of the Illinois General Assembly begins, legislation is introduced by your senators and representatives. Over 6,000 pieces of legislation were introduced last year, and we are currently in the period when legislation is introduced. As these bills are introduced, I read the synopsis of every bill to see if and how it will affect not only our industry, but the contracting business in general. From there, an active list and a watch list are created so that we can accurately track and work on the legislation as it progresses through the legislative process. Last year we had over 250 bills on the watch list and around 45 on the active list. Legislative reports are then created which I email to our officers, directors, local associations, and other industry partners on a regular basis, and also print in the Illinois Master Plumber magazine. Legislative alerts are issued when we need people to make contact with their representative or senator on a particular issue. Legislators often reach out to me to ask our stance on a particular bill, or for a bit of education on what we are all about.

Once laws are passed, often times rules must be written to implement the law. This goes through the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) process. The Illinois Register comes out weekly and I monitor that closely for any rulemaking that would affect what we do. For example, changes to the Illinois Plumbing Code and Title 35 (cross connection control) would go through this process.

I work closely with Jessica Newbold at IMSCA on various pieces of legislation that are of interest to both groups. We have a great working relationship that benefits both organizations.

This is just a short explanation of how we work diligently to promote and protect our industry within the state of Illinois. At some point in the future, maybe I can provide an article that is more encompassing on "how the sausage is made".

Memorials may be made to St. Jude Children's Hospital.



Statement From Secretary Of Labor Marty Walsh On Vaccination, Testing

U.S. Secretary of Labor Marty Walsh issued the following statement on the Supreme Court ruling on the department's Occupational Safety and Health Administration's emergency temporary standard on vaccination and testing:

"I am disappointed in the court's decision, which is a major setback to the health and safety of workers across the country. OSHA stands by the Vaccination and Testing Emergency Temporary Standard as the best way to protect the nation's workforce from a deadly virus that is infecting more than 750,000 Americans each day and has taken the lives of nearly a million Americans.

"OSHA promulgated the ETS under clear authority established by Congress to protect workers facing grave danger in the workplace, and COVID is without doubt such a danger. The emergency temporary standard is based on science and data that show the effectiveness of vaccines against the spread of coronavirus and the grave danger faced by unvaccinated workers. The commonsense standards established in the ETS remain critical, especially during the current surge, where unvaccinated people are 15-20 times more likely to die from COVID-19 than vaccinated people. OSHA will be evaluating all options to ensure workers are protected from this deadly virus.

"We urge all employers to require workers to get vaccinated or tested weekly to most effectively fight this deadly virus in the workplace. Employers are responsible for the safety of their workers on the job, and OSHA has comprehensive COVID-19 guidance at www.osha.gov/coronavirus/safework to help them uphold their obligation.

"Regardless of the ultimate outcome of these proceedings, OSHA will do everything in its existing authority to hold businesses accountable for protecting workers, including under the COVID-19 National Emphasis Program and General Duty Clause."

Safety Leadership Starts With You

Time and time again, the topics of safety leadership and risk management culture are brought up at businesses around the country. As leaders, you have a responsibility to help keep your operations running smoothly and ensuring your employees are working to the best of their abilities. But from an overarching perspective, safety leadership must start at the top — with you.

Risk Identification – When it comes to risk management, identifying the root causes of accidents and injuries and remedying them immediately using a risk management plan can help create a healthier, more stable business. Take the time to periodically conduct a workplace analysis that includes the inside and outside of the building. Focus on:

- General operations
- Machines and equipment
- Employee processes and work practices
- Housekeeping safety
- Clean walking surfaces
- Well lit and organized storage and loading zones
- Any other a reas and activities necessary to perform safely well at your workplace

Take notes when potential hazards are found, gather the information, and develop plans for what is needed to control situations that may lead to unacceptable consequences. As necessary, endeavor to promptly correct workplace hazards. Safety guidelines are more effective if they are presented in a written format — create a formal safety manual and present it to employees. In this, include the means for holding employees accountable for any unsafe work habits or conditions.

Lead by Example - Your actions as a leader hold a great deal of value. As you interact with others, you should demonstrate a high level of understanding for the safety of your business, and your actions should reflect the culture of a workplace that encourages others to follow your lead.

If you see areas that need work, note them and address them. Any employee infractions should be documented and followed up on, and training should be assigned promptly. By continuously following your risk management plan and showing interest in a safe workplace, you demonstrate to your employees the level of dedication and respect that you have for them, and for your business model.

Listen to Employees – Your employees are on the front lines, and often interact with job-specific risks that you may not be entirely familiar with. If they raise safety concerns or offer suggestions about areas of their jobs, take the time to listen to them, and work to remedy the situation. Job hazard analyses are also more accurate when employees are involved.

In turn, work with them on a reas that they may need further training in, along with regular refresher courses for specific tasks. By working alongside your employees to come up with relevant topics, you can keep them involved in regular training.

A risk manager is an important part of any business. Your role requires care, organization, and planning, as well as confidence and the energy to take control of a business's risk management culture. You will recognize the importance of designing and following through on a comprehensive risk management plan in order to best help protect your business's people and bottom line.

ILLINOIS PHCC PAST PRESIDENT'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- 1. Name of the Scholarship Fund shall be the "Illinois PHCC Assn. Past President's Club Scholarship Award".
- 2. Scholarship is established through dues income to Past President's Club.
- 3. A scholarship shall be awarded to an individual who has been nominated by a member of the Illinois PHCC Past President's Club who has been a member in good standing for the past two years.
- 4. Applicant must have the following qualifications:
 - a. Applicant must be a member of the senior class or graduate of a secondary school.
 - b. Pursue or desire to pursue courses of study such as may prepare them to serve or to advance the interest of the plumbing-heating-cooling industry.
- 5. The President of the Past President's Club shall be the Chairman and appoint two members to assist him in selecting the Scholarship Winner.
- 6. In no case shall more than one Scholarship be awarded to any one applicant, but the Scholarship Committee may award more than one scholarship at their discretion.
- 7. Scholarships shall be awarded at an event of the Illinois PHCC in June 2022.
- 8. The Executive Director shall be directed to inform the applicant who will be awarded the Scholarship.
- 9. Applicants not winning the award may be eligible to apply the following year.
- 10. The Scholarship money shall be made payable to the school of the applicant's choice. If the winner has changed schools since applying, he or she shall notify the IL PHCC Executive Director immediately.
- 11. If a recipient should drop out of school during the year, the balance of the award should be returned to the Past President's Club.

Application must be received in the Illinois PHCC office no later than June 1, 2022.



We are looking ahead to 2022 and trying to plan out what HR issues our company should be prepared for. What are some of the things our HR dept. should focus on this year?

ANSWER

In addition to the normal workplace concerns that HR always has to deal with, 2022 will present some new challenges to consider. The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic are still being felt in the workplace and will affect HR in a number of ways. Other top concerns include a focus on diversity, equity and inclusion in the workplace, employee well-being, and the competitive hiring market.

One effect of the pandemic is that some workplaces are just now returning to in-person work after a sudden shift to remote work. Adjusting to working with coworkers in person again may be a challenge for some employees that creates headaches for HR. Planning ahead for this re-adjustment period may smooth the way for returning to in-person work.

You may find that some employees prefer remote work to coming into the office and that others prefer a hybrid approach, with some days spent in the office and some days at home. Working with employees to successfully navigate a hybrid workplace will be a common challenge for HR departments in many industries. The best way to do this will depend on the nature of your particular workplace.

Employers will also need to be aware of required COVID protocols, which continue to evolve based on location and federal, state and local guidelines. One particular issue to pay attention to is the ongoing litigation regarding federal vaccine mandates for large private employers, health care workers and federal contractors. The outcome of those lawsuits, which are expected to be decided by the Supreme Court, will affect many employers across the country. Other employers may be affected by state or local requirements.

Many companies are also focusing efforts in improving diversity, equity and inclusion within the workplace. These efforts include working to increase diversity in hiring so that many different groups are represented in the workplace, ensuring that all employees are fairly compensated and have access to opportunities within the company and fostering a sense of belonging for employees within the company.

Employee well-being in general is something that many employers will be concerned about in 2022. Employees are being increasingly vocal about their needs related to work-life balance, mental and physical health, flexible work, leave for personal and family needs, professional development and finding meaning and personal satisfaction in their work. How to incorporate these things into the workplace culture will be a top priority for 2022.

All of these issues will also affect the continuing challenge of a competitive hiring market. Potential candidates have the ability to be selective about positions they are considering and can expand their job searches geographically thanks to the increase in remote work. Along with more traditional things like compensation and employee benefits, company culture and flexible work options will be a critical selling point if your company is hiring in 2022.

OSHA reminds employers that they must post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes job-related injuries and illnesses logged during 2021. Each year, between February 1 and April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or

PHCC ILLINOIS AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP RULES

 - Three letters of recommendation.
 - One letter must be from a sponsor, who is a member in good standing of Illinois PHCC Auxiliary.
 - The other two letters must be from people who are not relatives, but know the applicant personally and can attest to the applicant's character and provide other pertinent information. Knowledge of parents would not necessarily qualify them for having knowledge of applicant.
 - Photo of the applicant.
 - Official transcripts—see details on application form.
- 5. The deadline for submitting application is May 27, 2022.
 - Application must be postmarked no later than this date and include all the information required. If it is incomplete, application materials will be discarded and applicant will not be considered for a scholarship. Applicants may resubmit the following year.


