It is almost time for the Illinois PHCC Expo & Educational Day in Oakbrook Terrace and we are very excited!



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The Spring Session of the 103rd Illinois General Assembly began on January 11th. New legislation is being introduced daily and we have been monitoring and reviewing each piece as it is introduced. The bill introduction deadline dates are February 10th in the Senate and February 17th in the House. The scheduled adjournment date for the General Assembly this year is May 19th rather than the traditional May 31st. There are many bills that deal with Energy Conservation, Workforce Development, Employment, Procurement, Design/Build, and Utilities that we will be carefully watching to see how they may affect our industry. Below are a few of the bills we are watching and their current status.

Plumbing/Piping/Trade Related Bills:

HB 316 (E. Welch) Makes a technical change in the Fire Sprinkler Dormitory Act. Referred to House Rules.

HB 441 (E. Welch) Makes a technical change in the Restroom Access Act. Referred to House

HB 670 (E. Welch) Makes a technical change in the Fire and Smoke Damper Inspection Act. Referred to House Rules.

HB 1164 (J. Hoffman) Amends the Regulatory Sunset Act to extend the repeal date of provisions of the Illinois Plumbing License Law concerning irrigation contractors from January 1, 2024 to January 1, 2029.

HB 1286 (K. Stuart) Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act to provide any multiple-occupancy restroom may be all-gender. Requires specified signage, stall dividers, and urinal partitions. Provides ratio requirements on the number of required fixtures. Requires IDPH to adopt rules to implement the provisions.

SB 32 (D. Harmon) Makes a technical change in the Employee Washroom Act. Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 126 (C. Villanueva) Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act to provide any multiple-occupancy restroom may be all-gender. Requires specified signage, stall dividers, and urinal partitions. Provides ratio requirements on the number of required fixtures. Requires IDPH to adopt rules to implement the provisions. Referred to Senate Assignments.

Other Construction/Business Related Bills:

SB 133 (L. Holmes) This is an initiative of our industry partner association, IMSCA, and it amends the Public Construction Bond Act to provide that a local government entity may not withhold more than 5% retainage when a contractor has furnished a surety bond or its equivalent. Referred to Senate Assignments.





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US DOL ANNOUNCES **ADJUSTMENTS TO OSHA PENALTIES**

The U.S. Department of Labor announced changes to Occupational Safety and Health Administration civil penalty amounts based on cost-of-living adjustments for 2023.

In 2015, Congress passed the Federal Civil Penalties Inflation Adjustment Act Improvements Act to advance the effectiveness of civil monetary penalties and to maintain their deterrent effect. Under the Act, agencies are required to publish "catch-up" rules that adjust the level of civil monetary penalties and make subsequent annual adjustments for inflation no later than January 15 of each year. Since January 15 fell on a Sunday and January 16 was a federal holiday, the new OSHA penalty amounts became effective Jan. 17, 2023.

EMPLOYERS MUST POST OSHA FORM 300A

OSHA reminds employers that they must post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes job-related injuries and illnesses logged during 2022 . Each year, between February 1 and April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and those in certain low-hazard industries are exempt from OSHA recordkeeping and posting requirements. Visit OSHA's Recordkeeping Rule webpage at https://www.osha.gov/injuryreporting/ for information on recordkeeping requirements.

OSHA's maximum penalties for serious and other-than-serious violations will increase from \$14,502 per violation to \$15,625 per violation. The maximum penalty for willful or repeated violations will increase from \$145,027 per violation to \$156,259 per violation.

We terminated an employee a few months ago for poor performance and misconduct. We recently received a phone call from another company that is considering hiring this individual. The company is asking for a reference. What should we tell them? Are we allowed to say why the employee was fired? If we tell the truth and the employee does not get the new job, can he sue us?

NSWER

To limit exposure to liability, employers must proceed cautiously when providing references to other prospective employers, even if a former employee executes a release. Some companies choose to provide only "neutral" reference information, such as dates of employment and positions held. Other companies may choose to provide more detailed information in an effort to assist other prospective employers with their hiring decisions. Whatever an employer's decision, its policy should be consistent for all requests to avoid discrimination claims, meaning employers should avoid responding to some reference requests while refusing to respond to others.

If an employer wishes to provide substantive reference information (such as job performance or the reason for termination), keep in mind that, while in some cases the references will be positive, in others they may be negative. If an employer says something about a former employee that results in the individual not obtaining subsequent employment, an employer could be opening itself up to, among other things, liability for a defamation claim. While truth is a defense to a defamation claim, it is always better, of course, to avoid a claim in the first place rather than having to defend one. If an employer chooses to provide substantive reference information, it is a best practice to have local counsel review the employer's response.

As a final note, there may be some instances in which reference information is required, such as when information is subpoenaed or if a former employee applies for employment with the federal government. In these scenarios, an employer may be legally required to provide additional information.

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
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


IRS ISSUES MILEAGE RATES FOR 2023

The Internal Revenue Service has issued the 2023 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on January 1, 2023, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 65.5 cents per mile driven for business use, up 3 cents from the midyear increase setting the rate for the second half of 2022.
- 22 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes for qualified active-duty members of the Armed Forces, consistent with the increased midyear rate set for the second half of 2022.
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations; the rate is set by statute and remains unchanged from 2022.



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IRS ISSUES MILEAGE RATES FOR 2023 CONT.

These rates apply to electric and hybrid-electric automobiles, as well as gasoline and dieselpowered vehicles.

The standard mileage rate for business use is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile. The rate for medical and moving purposes is based on the variable costs.

It is important to note that under the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, taxpayers cannot claim a miscellaneous itemized deduction for

unreimbursed employee travel expenses.

Taxpayers always have the option of calculating the actual costs of using their vehicle rather than using the standard mileage rates.

Taxpayers can use the standard mileage rate but generally must opt to use it in the first year the car is available for business use. Then, in later years, they can choose either the standard mileage rate or actual expenses. Leased vehicles must use the standard mileage rate method for the entire lease period (including renewals) if the standard mileage rate is chosen.

Notice 2023-03 contains the optional 2023 standard mileage rates, as well as the maximum automobile cost used to calculate the allowance under a fixed and variable rate (FAVR) plan. In addition, the notice provides the maximum fair market value of employerprovided automobiles first made available to employees for personal use in calendar year 2023 for which employers may use the fleet-average valuation rule in or the vehicle cents-per-mile valuation rule.

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Has Inflation Left Your Business Underinsured?



AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP RULES

Scholarships for college or vocational education are awarded by the Illinois Auxiliary for a minimum or \$500.00 up to a maximum of \$2,000.00 each year in June, as funds are available.

- 1. The applicant must be at least a freshman in college having completed one full semester with at least 8 credit hours of study. Seniors in high school may NOT apply.
- 2. No person may receive more than one award from the Illinois Auxiliary during his or her academic career. There cannot be more than two awards per family per year. A permanent list of recipients will be kept in the scholarship files.
- 3. In addition to the completed application form, the applicant must submit the following:
 - A letter from the applicant with personal data, family size, explanation of need for scholarship monies, and career plans. Also include information about participation in high school, college, and community activities as well as work experience. Knowledge of and/or working experiences with plumbing industry may be included, but is not necessary.
 - Three letters of recommendation.
 - One letter must be from a sponsor who is a member in good standing of the Illinois PHCC Auxiliary.
 - The other two letters must be from people who know the applicant personally and can attest to the applicant's character. They may also provide additional pertinent information such as academic performance and involvement in extra-curricular activities. Knowledge of parents does not necessarily qualify them for having knowledge of applicant.
 - Photo of the applicant.
 - Official transcripts—see details on application form.
- The deadline for submitting the application is May 26, 2023.
 - Application must be postmarked no later than this date and include all the information required. If it is incomplete, application materials will be discarded and applicant will not be considered for a scholarship. Applicants may resubmit the following year.
