

EMPLOYERS MUST POST OSHA FORM 300A

OSHA reminds employers that they must post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes job-related injuries and illnesses logged during 2022 . Each year, between February 1 and April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and those in certain low-hazard industries are exempt from OSHA recordkeeping and posting requirements. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE BY BEV POTTS

The Spring Session of the 103rd Illinois General Assembly began on January11th. The bill introduction deadlines in both the House and Senate have passed. Below are some of the bills we are watching and their current status.

Plumbing/Piping/Trade Related Bills:

HB 316 (E. Welch) Makes a technical change in the Fire Sprinkler Dormitory Act. Referred to House Rules.
HB 441 (E. Welch) Makes a technical change in the Restroom Access Act. Referred to House Rules.
HB 670 (E. Welch) Makes a technical change in the Fire and Smoke Damper Inspection Act. Referred to House Rules.

HB 1164 (J. Hoffman) Amends the Regulatory Sunset Act to extend the repeal date of provisions of the Illinois Plumbing License Law concerning irrigation contractors from January 1, 2024 to January 1, 2029. On 2nd Reading in the House.

HB 1198 (D. Vella) Creates the Program to License Electricians Act. Assigned to House Labor & Commerce Committee.

HB 1286 (K. Stuart) Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act to provide any multiple-occupancy restroom maybe all-gender. Requires specified signage, stall dividers, and urinal partitions. Provides ratio requirements on the number of required fixtures. Requires IDPH to adopt rules to implement the provisions. Assigned to House Human Services Committee.

HB 1834 (T. McCombie) Makes a technical change in the Restroom Access Act. Referred to House Rules.

HB 2221 (M. Flowers) Creates an income tax credit in the amount of 50% of the installation cost for taxpayers who have an approved NFPA 13D residential fire sprinkler system installed in a new or existing residential dwelling. House Revenue & Finance.

HB 2270 (S. Kifowit) Makes a technical change in the Illinois Plumbing License Law. Referred to House Rules. HB 2322 (E. Gonzalez, Jr.) Creates the Water Reuse Task Force Act. Referred to Rules.

HB 2621 (S. Kifowit) Provides that IDPH shall create a pilot program to allow the Department to enter into an agreement with a licensed plumber employed

by a municipality to do inspections on behalf of the Department and submit appropriate documentation as requested to verify the inspections were completed to the standards required by the Department and outlined in the partnership. Referred to House Rules.

HB 3046 (A. Williams) Provides that the IEPA shall propose and the Board shall adopt (1) amendments to the Board's primary drinking water standards that will repeal the prohibition on the use of recycled sewage treatment plant effluent set forth in Title 35 and that will make any other revisions to those rules that are necessary to facilitate water reuse in the State and (2) rules establishing programs for both direct potable and nonpotable reuse of treated wastewater, including rules establishing permitting standards and a permit application process. Referred to House Rules.

HB 3839 (B. Halbrook) Provides that a county or municipality may not adopt any regulation that prohibits the use of natural gas in new construction. House Rules. SB 32 (D. Harmon) Makes a technical change in the Employee Washroom Act. Referred to Senate Assignments. SB 126 (C. Villanueva) Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act to provide any multiple-occupancy restroom maybe all-gender. Requires specified signage, stall dividers, and urinal partitions. Provides ratio requirements on the number of required fixtures. Requires IDPH to adopt rules to implement the provisions. Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 650 & SB 726 (D. Harmon) Makes a technical change in the Restroom Access Act. Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 847 (D. Harmon) Amends the Fire and Smoke
Damper Inspection Act. Referred to Senate Assignments.
SB 1168 (J. Curran) Amends the Fire and Smoke
Damper Inspection Act. Referred to Senate Assignments.
SB 1241 (C. Rose) Creates the Energy Performance
Contracting Act. Referred to Senate Assignments.
SB 1366 (R. Villivalam) Provides that every
municipality shall inspect all single-family residences and
multi-family buildings in the municipality built before 1978

for the presence of lead paint and lead piping by June 1, 2025. Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 1370 (C. Wilcox) Creates the Fuel Gas Detector Act to provide that at least one fuel gas detector shall be installed in every room containing an appliance fueled by propane, natural gas, or liquefied petroleum gas. Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 1420 (L. Holmes) Makes a technical change in the Illinois Plumbing License Law. Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 1523 (L. Ellman) Creates the Water Quality Assurance Act. Provides that new and existing health care facilities shall develop and implement water management programs with specified elements to control the growth and spread of opportunistic waterborne pathogens. Other provisions. Assigned to Senate Health & Human Services. SB 1683 (R. Martwick) Creates an income tax credit in the amount of 50% of the installation cost for taxpayers who have an approved NFPA 13D residential fire sprinkler system installed in a new or existing residential dwelling. Assigned to Senate Revenue.

SB 1715 (S. Hilton) Amends the Illinois Plumbing License Law. Provides that the Department shall adopt a rule requiring that for each drinking fountain in any construction where a drinking fountain is required under the Illinois Plumbing Code, there shall also be a bottle filling station or a combined bottle filling station and drinking fountain. Assigned to Senate Local Government. SB 1793 (E. Jones III) Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act to provide any multiple-occupancy restroom maybe all-gender. Requires specified signage, stall dividers, and urinal partitions. Provides ratio requirements on the number of required fixtures. Requires IDPH to adopt rules to implement the provisions. Referred to Assignments.

SB 1804 (L. Murphy) Provides that use of a refrigerant is not prohibited if the refrigerant is identified as a safe alternative under a specified federal statute and is contained within equipment that is in accordance with specified federal safety standards. Assigned to Senate Environment & Conservation Committee.

SB 1938 (D. DeWitte) Provides that, in the case of water main installation projects, all water main-related appurtenances, and specifically fire hydrants and valves, shall be included in the Agency's written approval of specified public water supply plans. Requires fire hydrants and valves to be designed and installed in accordance with

specified standards. Assigned to Senate Local Government Committee.

SB 2049 (R. Villivalam) Creates the Mechanical Insulation Energy Audit Act to provide that the EPA shall perform a mechanical insulation energy audit of every public building within the State to ensure the building's mechanical systems function at operating temperatures that minimize energy loss and ensure public health and safety. Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 2283 (R. Villivalam) & HB 2778 (N. Manley) Creates the Safety in Professional Steel Erection Licensure Act to license all steel erectors in the State. The definition of steel erection includes the word plumbing the covered activities. While we feel the intent the word plumbing is referring to vertical alignment, we will be watching carefully to ensure that this does not refer to the trade of plumbing. Referred to Senate Assignments, and House Rules.

SB 2368 (D. Koehler) Creates the State Building and Residential Codes Act. Provides that the Capital Development Board, in consultation with the Department of Natural Resources, shall adopt a Building Code that establishes minimum requirements for the construction of commercial and residential buildings. Referred to Senate Assignments.

Other Construction/Business Related Bills:

SB 133 (L. Holmes) This is an initiative of our industry partner association, IMSCA, and it amends the Public Construction Bond Act to provide that a local government entity may not withhold more than 5% retainage when a contractor has furnished a surety bond or its equivalent. Assigned to Senate Judiciary Committee.

SB 1704 (R. Villivalam) Another initiative of IMSCA, this bill amends the Mechanics Lien Act to allow Liens to be delivered by overnight delivery companies, such as FedEx and UPS, rather than only by certified mail return receipt requested. In Assignments.

SB 1570 (K. Lightford) and HB 1504 (L. Ford) These bills would allow municipalities to utilize design/ build. Assigned to Senate Local Gov't, and House Rules.

There are many other bills we are watching that deal with Public Private Partnerships, Prevailing Wage, Procurement, Public Utilities, Indoor Air Quality/HVAC, Workforce, Energy, and more.

UAC COLLECTIVE BARGAINING SEMINAR FOCUSED ON PREPARATION FOR EFFECTIVE UNION CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS

An engaged audience of both seasoned and novice association bargaining team members concentrated on education and preparation for union contract negotiations at the UAC's January 30, 2023 "Constructive Collective Bargaining" seminar in Bloomington, IL. Planned and presented by the *Union Affiliated Contractors* (UAC - a Business Interest Group [BIG] of the National PHCC), the full-day event drew over 50 attendees comprised of signatory PHCC-affiliated contractors and association officials from 8 states.

Educating the Association's Bargaining Team is Crucial for Better Outcomes for *Both* Sides

National PHCC President & UAC Vice Chair David Frame (Bob Frame Plumbing Services – South Bend, IN) set the tone for a day devoted to substantial learning as he welcomed the registrants. "The PHCC aims to help members run better businesses through education, networking and resources," Frame emphasized. "Signatory contractors, like you and me, occupy a distinct and crucial role in our trade. We set the benchmark for all contractors for the most skilled and capable technicians. PHCC contractors are up to all challenges. The fact that we're all here proves that we persevere."

UAC Chair Brian Rich (GA Rich & Sons – Deer Creek, IL) in his opening remarks cited the value of building and maintaining mutually respectful and productive relationships with our union colleagues. "As contractors, we prefer competent competition to keep up our industry standards. The same is true with us and our union counterparts. When both sides come to bargaining prepared and organized, the process improves. It's one reason that the UAC has made contractor education a cornerstone of what we

do for you. Bargaining is one of many topics we plan to cover, yet it may be the most significant. Insights, instruction, best practices and advice on CBA negotiations will be an ongoing UAC effort."

Distinct Sessions Delivered Practical Building Blocks of Information and Preparation for Bargaining

Four distinct sessions focusing on specific areas of collective bargaining were featured. Appropriately, the first presentation starting at 8:30 a.m. (by attorney Richard Samson – *Ogletree-Deakins/ Chicago*) titled "Basics of Bargaining" offered an introduction to the subject. It served both as a refresher for attendees who'd been previously involved in union contract negotiations, and as a primary tutorial for beginners. Included were definitions of terms, overviews of standard practices, and common sequences of events.

The second seminar session, led by attorney John Nesse (*Management Guidance LLP/St. Paul MN*), explored how a chapter's negotiating team can properly lay the groundwork for negotiations. "Doing Your Homework: Planning and Preparation by the Association for Bargaining" explored research techniques covering items such as industry hours, benefit funding levels, results from other trades' settlements, economic information, the political climate and other relevant data. Pertinent advice on a variety of "do's and don'ts" and general behavior advice throughout negotiations was also offered throughout this session.

The third session, conducted by attorney Christina Wernick *(Laner-Muchin/Chicago)*, examined bargaining from the labor side's point of view in

"Understanding the Union's Goals and Priorities in Contract Negotiations." Attendees gained insights into the priorities that come into play as our counterparts seek a satisfactory settlement, and the tactics and resources unions apply toward that aim. Since Wernick spent a number of years as legal counsel to a large construction union and its benefit funds prior to joining this managementfocused firm, she was able to offer unique and practical perspectives from both sides of the bargaining table.

The next session, following the luncheon, utilized attorney Richard Samson for the second time as its presenter and provided a more advanced look at union contract negotiations. "Beyond Bargaining: A 'Nuts & Bolts' Overview of Negotiations in a Multi-Employer Setting" as the name suggested covered a range of more complex areas of contract talks. Among the topics covered in depth were contract types; bargaining rights delegations; deadlocks, strikes and lockouts; minute taking; bargaining team formation and spokesperson selection; interim agreements; tentative agreements on specific proposals; ratification procedures; and other higher-level considerations.


Closing Session: Forum - Panel Discussion -Q&A Concluded an Information-Packed Day of Learning

The final session, moderated by seminar emcee S.J. Peters (Executive Director of the PCA of Greater Chicago, a local chapter of the PHCC), took the form of a panel discussion and a Q&A forum featuring all three of the day's presenters: attorneys John Nesse; Richard Samson; and Christina Wernick. Audience questions were addressed "live" and via index cards for anonymity. Also used was a comprehensive list of questions furnished in advance by the presenters as "those we wish contractors would ask but rarely do." The nearly 90-minute discussion covered a mix of pertinent subjects from bargaining, to trust funds, to grievances, to jurisdictional issues, to reciprocity when working outside of the union's territory, to CBA duration considerations, and more. The seminar ended with a rousing round of applause, with attendees still discussing additional topics oneon-one afterwards with the instructors. A survey asking attendees for topic ideas for future seminars was collected, and a closing reception concluded the day.

The UAC and PHCC would like to thank and acknowledge our sponsors: Milwaukee Tool and Bradford White for their generous and consistent support. Also deserving of recognition is the National PHCC staff – particularly Senior Director, Member Services and Customer Care Kim Dresser. The planning committee also relied on and appreciated the leadership and direction from National PHCC President David Frame and UAC Chair Brian Rich, and the "trifecta" of Illinois PHCC State Chapter Executive Director Bev Potts and

the Bloomington/Normal Chapter for arranging and overseeing the meeting site; Illinois State Chapter Associate Director Shelly Lott for coordinating all the graphic design for print and electronic communication; and S.J. Peters of the PCA of Greater Chicago for taking charge of program content and serving both as the day's emcee and photographer. Finally, our gratitude to the seminar speakers for their relevant and outstanding presentations: attorneys John Nesse, Richard Samson, and Christina Wernick. 

PAST PRESIDENT'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- 1. Name of the Scholarship Fund shall be the "Illinois PHCC Assn. Past President's Club Scholarship Award".
- 2. Scholarship is established through dues income to Past President's Club.
- 3. A scholarship shall be awarded to an individual who has been nominated by a member of the Illinois PHCC Past President's Club who has been a member in good standing for the past two years.
- 4. Applicant must have the following qualifications:
 - a. Applicant must be a member of the senior class or graduate of a secondary school.
 - b. Pursue or desire to pursue courses of study such as may prepare them to serve or to advance the interest of the plumbing-heating-cooling industry.
- 5. The President of the Past President's Club shall be the Chairman and appoint two members to assist him in selecting the Scholarship Winner.
- 6. In no case shall more than one Scholarship be awarded to any one applicant, but the Scholarship Committee may award more than one scholarship at their discretion.
- 7. Scholarships shall be awarded at an event of the Illinois PHCC in June 2023.
- 8. The Executive Director shall be directed to inform the applicant who will be awarded the Scholarship.
- 9. Applicants not winning the award may be eligible to apply the following year.
- 10. The Scholarship money shall be made payable to the school of the applicant's choice. If the winner has changed schools since applying, he or she shall notify the IL PHCC Executive Director immediately.
- 11. If a recipient should drop out of school during the year, the balance of the award should be returned to the Past President's Club.


- 1. The applicant must be at least a freshman in college having completed one full semester with at least 8 credit hours of study. Seniors in high school may NOT apply.
- 2. No person may receive more than one award from the Illinois Auxiliary during his or her academic career. There cannot be more than two awards per family per year. A permanent list of recipients will be kept in the scholarship files.
- 3. In addition to the completed application form, the applicant must submit the following:
 - A letter from the applicant with personal data, family size, explanation of need for scholarship monies, and career plans. Also include information about participation in high school, college, and community activities as well as work experience. Knowl edge of and/or working experiences with plumbing industry may be included, but is not necessary.
 - Three letters of recommendation.
 - One letter must be from a sponsor who is a member in good standing of the Illinois PHCC Auxiliary.
 - The other two letters must be from people who know the applicant personally and can attest to the applicant's character. They may also provide additional pertinent information such as academic performance and involvement in extra-curricular activities. Knowledge of parents does not necessarily qualify them for having knowledge of applicant.
 - Photo of the applicant.
 - Official transcripts—see details on application form.
- 4. The deadline for submitting the application is May 26, 2023.
 - Application must be postmarked no later than this date and include all the information required. If it is incomplete, application materials will be discarded and applicant will not be considered for a scholarship. Applicants may resubmit the following year.
