





## EMPLOYERS MUST POST OSHA FORM 300A

OSHA reminds employers that they must post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes job-related injuries and illnesses logged during 2023. Each year, between February 1 and April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and those in certain low-hazard industries are exempt from OSHA recordkeeping and posting requirements. ## Illinois PHCC Legislative Update

The Spring Session of the 103rd Illinois General Assembly began on January 16th. New legislation is being introduced daily and bills from last year are still in play. We have been monitoring and reviewing each piece as it is introduced. The bill introduction deadline date is February 9th in both the Senate and the House. The scheduled adjournment date for the General Assembly this year is May 24th. There are many bills that deal with Energy Conservation, Workforce Development, Employment, Procurement, Design/Build, and Utilities that we will be carefully watching to see how they may affect our industry. Below are a few of the bills we are watching and their current status.

#### Plumbing/Piping/Trade Related Bills:


**HB 4287 (R. SPAIN)** Amends the Energy Efficient Building Act to provide that the term "Code" means the 2018 edition of the International Code Council's International Energy Conservation Code (currently, the latest published edition). Referred to House Rules.

HB 4528 (J. MASON) Amends the Rental Property Utility Service Act. Provides that a landlord shall repair any leaking water pipe of a tenant within 30 days of the landlord being notified of a leak. Provides that this does not apply to the landlord if the leaking water pipe is owned by a municipality or water utility.

HB 4549 (A. MOELLER) Amends the Illinois Plumbing License Law to provide that, beginning on July 1, 2024, food service establishments with less than 2,000 square feet may provide one unisex, readily accessible restroom facility for the public.

**SB 1666 (R. PETERS)** Creates the Thermal Energy Network and Jobs Acts.

The legislation defines thermal energy as piped noncombustible fluids used for transferring heat



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into and out of buildings for the purpose of reducing any resultant greenhouse gas emissions of all types of heating and cooling processes, including, but not limited to comfort heating and cooling, domestic hot water and refrigeration. Provides that the Illinois Commerce Commission shall initiate a proceeding within 3 months after the effective date of the amendatory Act to support the development of thermal energy networks. Re-assigned to the Senate Executive Committee.

#### SB 1938 (D. DEWITTE & D. FOWLER)

Amends the Environmental Protection Act to provide that, in the case of water main installation projects, all water main-related appurtenances, and specifically fire hydrants and valves, shall be included in the Agency's written approval of specified public water supply plans. Re-assigned to Senate Local Government.

SB 2702 (R. VILLIVALAM) Amends the Fire Sprinkler Contractor Licensing Act. Provides that "fire sprinkler inspector" means an individual who is qualified to perform routine inspection or testing of fire sprinkler systems and who is exclusively employed by a single fire sprinkler contractor (instead of employed or contracted by a fire sprinkler contractor). Provides that any individual who performs routine inspection or testing of any fire sprinkler system under the Act shall be exclusively employed by a single licensed fire sprinkler contractor (instead of be employed by a licensed fire sprinkler contractor). Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 2743 (L. ELLMAN & N. TORO) Creates the Water Plan Task Force Act. Establishes the State Water Plan Task Force and requires them to identify critical water issues, to develop and implement recommendations that address the critical water issues, and to reevaluate critical water issues and needs. Referred to Senate Assignments.

#### **Other Construction/Business Related Bills:**

HB 4317 (J. HOFFMAN) Amends the Mechanics Lien Act. Requires a sub-contractor, or party furnishing labor, materials, fixtures, apparatus, machinery, or services, to cause a notice of his or her claim and the amount due or to become due to the owner of record or the owner of record's agent or architect, or the superintendent having charge of the building or improvement, and, to the lending agency, if known. Requires the written notice to be sent by: (i) registered or certified mail, with return receipt requested; (ii) a nationally recognized delivery company with tracking service; or (iii) personal service. Provides that notice is considered served at the time the written notice is placed with the delivery service or in the mail. Referred to House Rules.

HB 4418 (W. DAVIS) Creates the Government Contract Retainage Act. Provides that interest shall accrue monthly on the first day of each month on retainage withheld by a governmental unit; Requires retainage to be paid not more than 60 days after being retained, including interest accrued, unless the retainage was withheld on the last pay period of a project shall, which shall be paid not more than 120 days after being retained. Referred to House Rules.

**SB 2729 (R. VILLIVALAM)** Same as HB 4418. Referred to Senate Assignments.

### DOL ANNOUNCES FINAL RULE ON CLASSIFYING WORKERS AS EMPLOYEES OR INDEPENDENT **CONTRACTORS**

The U.S. Department of Labor has announced a final rule to help employers and workers better understand when a worker qualifies as an employee and when they may be considered an independent contractor under the Fair Labor Standards Act.

The rule provides guidance on proper classification and seeks to combat employee misclassification, a serious problem that impacts workers' rights to minimum wage and overtime pay, facilitates wage theft, allows some employers to undercut their law-abiding competition and hurts the economy at-large.

The guidance provided by the final rule aligns with longstanding judicial precedent on which employers have previously relied to determine a worker's status as either an employee or independent contractor. The new rule will preserve essential worker rights and provide consistency for entities covered by the Fair Labor Standards Act.

The new "independent contractor" rule restores the multifactor analysis used by courts for decades, ensuring that all relevant factors are analyzed to determine whether a worker is an employee or an independent contractor. The rule addresses six factors that guide the analysis of a worker's relationship with an employer, including any opportunity for profit or loss a worker might have; the financial stake and nature of any resources a worker has invested in the work; the degree of permanence of the work relationship; the degree of control an employer has over the person's work; whether the work the person does is essential to the employer's business; and a factor regarding the worker's skill and initiative.

The rule separately rescinds the 2021 Independent Contractor Rule that the department believes is not consistent with the law and longstanding judicial precedent.

In crafting the new rule, the department's Wage and Hour Division considered feedback provided by stakeholders at forums in the summer of 2022 and during the comment period after the proposal's announcement in October 2022. The final rule takes effect on March 11, 2024.

#### **AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP RULES**

Scholarships for college or vocational education are awarded by the Illinois Auxiliary for a minimum or \$500.00 up to a maximum of \$2,000.00 each year in June, as funds are available.

- 1. The applicant must be at least a freshman in college having completed one full semester with at least 8 credit hours of study. Seniors in high school may NOT apply.
- 2. No person may receive more than one award from the Illinois Auxiliary during his or her academic career. There cannot be more than two awards per family per year. A permanent list of recipients will be kept in the scholarship files.
- 3. In addition to the completed application form, the applicant must submit the following:
  - A letter from the applicant with personal data, family size, explanation of need for scholarship monies, and career plans. Also include information about participation in high school, college, and community activities as well as work experience. Knowledge of and/or working experiences with plumbing industry may be included, but is not necessary.
  - Three letters of recommendation.
    - One letter must be from a sponsor who is a member in good standing of the Illinois PHCC Auxiliary.
    - The other two letters must be from people who know the applicant personally and can attest to the applicant's character. They may also provide additional pertinent information such as academic performance and involvement in extra-curricular activities. Knowledge of parents does not necessarily qualify them for having knowledge of applicant.
  - Photo of the applicant.
  - Official transcripts—see details on application form.
- The deadline for submitting the application is May 24, 2024.
  - Application must be postmarked no later than this date and include all the information required. If it is incomplete, application materials will be discarded and applicant will not be considered for a scholarship. Applicants may resubmit the following year.
  - The scholarship committee will have the final decision in awarding these scholarships. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact Gail McWilliams.

#### **Brushing Up on the OSHA Top 10**

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Top 10 list accounts for the most frequently cited standards following inspections of businesses and worksites by federal OSHA. This helpful list can be used as a guide to learning what common risks to watch out for, and accessing vital information to help avoid devastating — and costly — work injuries or fatalities.

Each year, OSHA posts their Top 10 violations after the month of April to allow the prior fiscal year's inspection data to finalize.<sup>1</sup>

In the fiscal year 2022, the Top 10 included:

- 1. Fall protection(C)
- 2. Hazard communication
- 3. Ladders(C)
- 4. Respiratory protection
- 5. Scaffolding<sup>(C)</sup>

- 6. Control of hazardous energy (lockout/tagout)
- 7. Powered industrial trucks
- 8. Fall protection training(C)
- 9. Eye and face protection(C)
- 10. Machinery and machine guarding

OSHA inspections across the nation are completed at both the state and federal levels. In 2022, over 69,000 OSHA inspections have occurred, resulting in more than 133,000 violations. ## Question

Our HR employees have access to other employees' confidential information, such as pay. One HR employee is talking to non-HR employees in our company about other employees' pay. Are we allowed to prevent her from sharing other employees' pay? I thought we weren't allowed to prevent employees from discussing pay.

## NSWER

Under the federal National Labor Relations Act, employees have the right to communicate with other employees at their workplaces about their wages. Wages are a vital term and condition of employment, and discussions of wages are often preliminary to organizing or other actions for mutual aid or protection. Employee discussions about their own compensation are protected by law even in workplaces where no union is present and/or no organizing is underfoot.

That said, managerial, HR and other employees who have access to compensation data for their subordinates or other employees in the organization (in the ordinary course of business) do not have the right to disclose that data toothers in the company who do not have a legitimate need to know it. Such discussions are not the same as employee discussions about their own compensation with each other for their mutual aid and protection. Employers must safeguard employees' personal information. In this regard, an employer should seek to prohibit managerial, supervisory, HR and other employees who legitimately have access to employee compensation data from discussing it with other employees who do not need to know it for appropriate business purposes.

Employers, of course, should nonetheless be cautious to avoid violating any employee's right to discuss his or her own wages. An employer may wish to consult with local counsel for assistance with drafting a policy that addresses these issues without running afoul of applicable law.

- 3. A scholarship shall be awarded to an individual who has been nominated by a member of the Illinois PHCC Past President's Club who has been a member in good standing for the past two years.
- 4. Applicant must have the following qualifications:
  - a. Applicant must be a member of the senior class or graduate of a secondary school.
  - b. Pursue or desire to pursue courses of study such as may prepare them to serve or to advance the interest of the plumbing-heating-cooling industry.
- 5. The President of the Past President's Club shall be the Chairman and appoint two members to assist him in selecting the Scholarship Winner.
- 6. In no case shall more than one Scholarship be awarded to any one applicant, but the Scholarship Committee may award more than one scholarship at their discretion.
- 7. Scholarships shall be awarded at an event of the Illinois PHCC in June 2024.
- 8. The Executive Director shall be directed to inform the applicant who will be awarded the Scholarship.
- 9. Applicants not winning the award may be eligible to apply the following year.
- 10. The Scholarship money shall be made payable to the school of the applicant's choice. If the winner has changed schools since applying, he or she shall notify the IL PHCC Executive Director immediately.
- 11. If a recipient should drop out of school during the year, the balance of the award should be returned to the Past President's Club.
